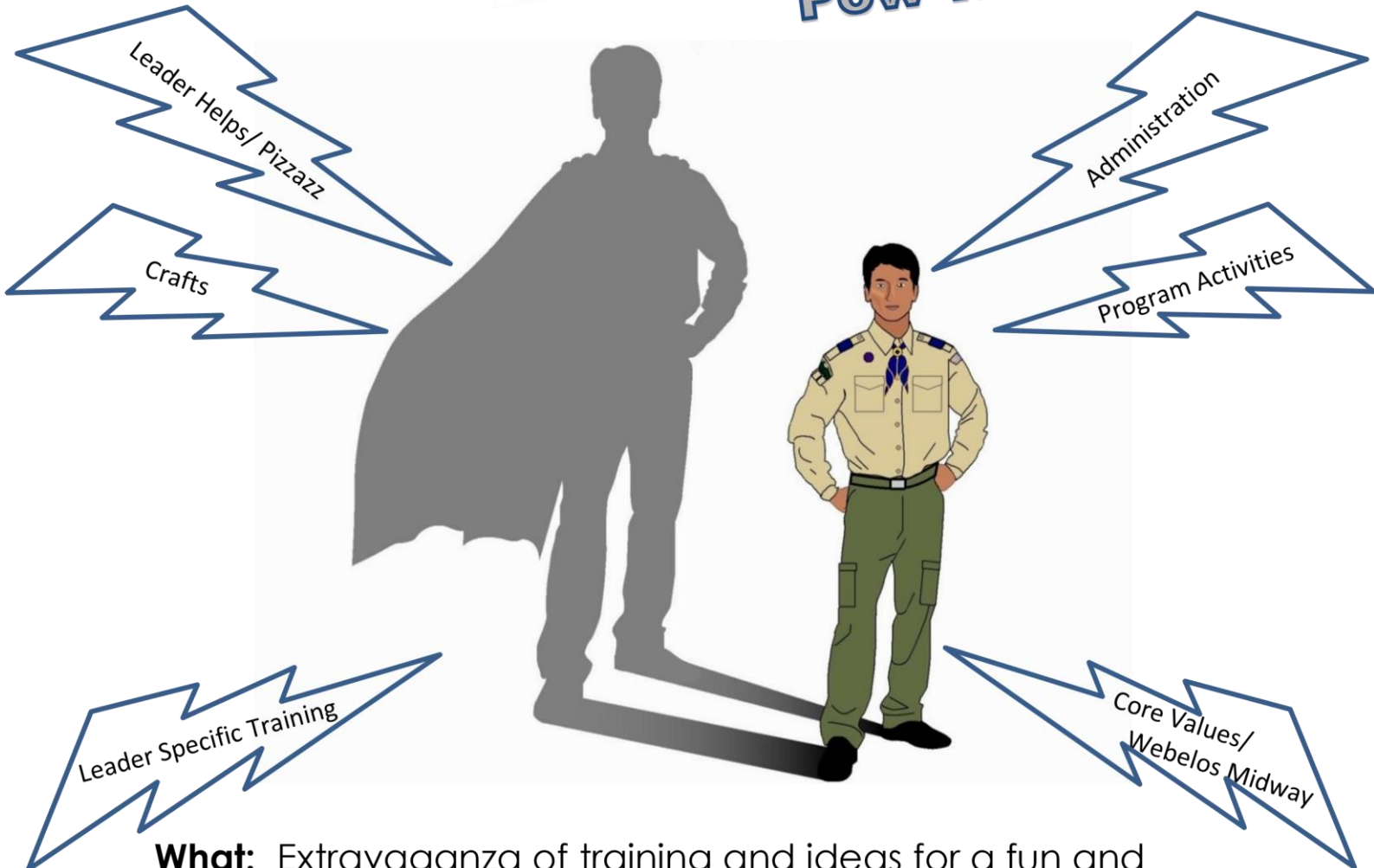

LEADER SPECIFIC TRAINING

- Den Leader Specific Training. (9:00 – 9:50)(1:00 – 1:50)
- Webelos Leader Specific Training. (10:00 – 10:50)
- Cubmaster Leader Specific Training. (11:00 – 11:50)

ADMINISTRATION

- Activity and Event Planning. (10:00 – 10:50) (1:00 – 1:50) For pack and districts leaders. How to plan an effective event, Cub-O-Ree, Tiger Go and See it, Family Fun Fair, or other event. Includes organization, promotion, and safety requirements.
- What do Successful Committees have in Common? (9:00 – 9:50) Roles of Committee members; gaining support of chartered organization; finding the right people to fill the roles; utilizing committee members.
- Is it Safe Out There, Batman? (9:00 – 9:50) Tour plans, age appropriate activities, medical forms, safety training, Guide to Safe Scouting - learn how to keep boys and leaders safe.
- 100 Super Ways to Say Thank You. (1:00 – 1:50) Learn the importance of recognition for leaders, and when and how to give recognitions. Identify types of awards, including national BSA as well as homemade awards.
- Record Keeping and How to Keep It. (9:00 – 9:50) (11:00 – 11:50) (1:00 – 1:50) This class will answer the questions of the What, Why and How and Who about creating and keeping accurate records on both leaders and boys.
- Captain America's First Aid. (11:00 – 11:50) Be prepared to calm the fears of your scouts. This class will cover basic first aid Cub Scout style. Be prepared for hands on activity.

- Woodcraft. (10:00 – 10:50) Creative ways with wood. Simple ideas for Cub Scout projects that can also be used to teach Cub Scout achievements and electives.
